INSIGHT FROM GOD'S WORD: "The Fear and Love of the Lord"

"The fear of the Lord" is such a medieval sounding phrase. In modernistic Christian thinking, the emphasis is on the love of God, the blessing of God and the prosperity which comes from God. God

seems to be a kind of lucky rabbit's foot whose purpose is to make us feel good about ourselves, our lifestyle choices, and our future or like a Santa Claus whose delight is to give us stuff.

The phrase "the fear of the Lord" (it's Hebrew original) occurs fourteen times in the Old Testament. The Greek phrase occurs just once in the New Testament in Acts 9:31, which describes the earliest Christian church, characterized by peace, numerical growth, and living in "the fear of the Lord," "the church throughout Judea, Galilee and Samaria enjoyed a time of peace. It was strengthened; and encouraged by the Holy Spirit, it grew in numbers, living in the fear of the Lord."

Psalm 34 teaches us what "the fear of the Lord" means, "11 Come, my children, listen to me; I will teach you the fear of the LORD. 12 Whoever of you loves life and desires to see many good days, 13 keep your tongue from evil and your lips from speaking lies. 14 Turn from evil and do good; seek peace and pursue it. 15 The eyes of the LORD are on the righteous and his ears are attentive to their cry." According to this psalm, living in "the fear of the Lord" is what the "righteous" do, characterized by turning from evil and doing good. And the righteous are simply those who trust in Jesus as their Savior from sin, the devil and hell, as Romans 1:17 tells us, "For in the gospel a righteousness from God is revealed, a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: 'The righteous will live by faith." This last phrase has the meaning of "those who are righteous by faith in Christ will live by faith in Christ!" The righteous by faith in Christ live in the fear of the Lord! Martin Luther, the great reformer, in explaining the Ten Commandments in his Small Catechism, explains each commandment by beginning with the phrase "we should fear and love God so that..." and then explains how the believer in Christ lives according to each commandment. Luther's phrase "fear and love" captures the essence of this important biblical phrase "the fear of the Lord." The Hebrew word means reverence and awe.

Reverence for God is simply another way of expressing the biblical concept of faith and trust in God, so that out of love for God, we turn from sin and evil and trust in God's promises centered in Christ, resulting in a life of doing good. So "the fear and love of the Lord" is what we all need in our lives—nothing else really matters! And God gives it to us as a gift! As Proverbs 14:27 says, "The fear of the LORD is a

fountain of life, turning a man from the snares of death."

What Do You Want? One of the best-known and mostbeloved psalms is Psalm 23, the "Shepherd Psalm." There we learn that the Lord is our Shepherd. And since He is our Shepherd, we will not want. We will not suffer want because the Lord, our Shepherd, will lead us to green pastures and beside still waters. In other words, the Lord, our Shepherd, will provide for all that we need in both body and soul. Yet, we live as though this is not the case. We live as though we actually suffer from want, that the Lord, our Shepherd, will not provide for all that we need. And thus, we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd. And that means that we live as though we are not the Lord's sheep. When do we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd? When we put anything else before Him and His provision for us. When we think that going to work is more important than receiv-ing His gifts in church on Sunday (in violation of the First and Third Commandments). When we fail to give generously of the first fruits of what the Lord has provided for us because we don't know what the future will bring (even though He has promised that He will lead us to green pas-tures and still waters). We live as though we are not the Lord's sheep when we think that the Lord is only in the busi-ness of helping those who will help themselves. We act this way because our minds are set on earthly, temporal things and not on heavenly, eternal things. We act this way because we have stopped hearing the call of our Shepherd, which comes through His Word. Through the Word of God, the Shepherd calls us to Himself. Through the Word, the Holy Spirit gathers and enlightens us with His gifts. Through the Word, we are kept holy and nourished in the one true faith, the faith that follows our Shepherd wherever He leads us. He promises to lead us to our true home, to the land flowing with milk and honey, to a better country, not of this world, but a heavenly one. And so, here's the Good News: the Lord is your Shepherd, even and especially for wayward sheep. For Jesus seeks and saves those who are lost. He finds the lost sheep and carries them back to the fold. He is the Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep. The Lord is your Shepherd. When the Israelites traveled in the desert for many days, they were tired and hungry. Psalm 105:40 The people asked, he brought quails, and satisfied them with the bread of heaven.
