Insight from the Word of God: What We Believe and Teach



A man was once asked: "what do you believe?" He answered: "why I believe what my church believes!" "And what does your church believe?" The man answered: "my church believes what I believe!!" In other words, the man really did not know what his church taught nor

how to express his own faith!

If you were asked the same questions, would you be able to tell someone what you believed and what your church believed? Below is a summary of our orthodox Lutheran faith as it is taken from the Bible:

- 1. The one and only God is **the Triune God** ("the Trinity") who is three coequal and divine Persons, namely the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The Trinity is eternal, almighty, all-knowing, everywhere present, and perfect in mercy and justice.
- 2. The entire **Bible** is God's verbally inspired revelation of Himself to mankind. The Bible is, therefore, without any error. Its central message is the saving work of Jesus Christ through his life, death and resurrection to bring forgiveness of sin and eternal life to all who believe in Him.
- 3. God, who is the Creator of all, also created man righteous and holy. When man **fell into sin**, as evidenced by his inability to keep the Ten Commandments, God sent his only and eternal Son, Jesus Christ, to bear the guilt and punishment of all our sin.
- 4. Jesus shared our **human nature** but lived the only perfect life on earth. On Good Friday, He suffered crucifixion in our place, resulting in His death. On Easter, He rose from the dead, body and soul, to bring victory over death and sin to all who have the gift of faith in Him.
- 5. The Holy Spirit desires to give faith to

- everyone through "the Means of Grace," namely, God's Word, the Bible, and the sacraments: the Lord's Supper and baptism.
- 5. Through the **Lord's Supper**, God offers the true body and blood of Christ in/with/under the bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins.
- 6. Through **baptism**, bestowed on babies, children, and adults, God creates and sustains faith in Christ, and promises the forgiveness of sins and new life in Him, all to be received by faith.
- 7. Because of Jesus' payment for all sins through His crucifixion, death, and resurrection full and free forgiveness is offered to everyone to be received by faith through the power of the Holy Spirit. Those who die in **unbelief** will suffer eternal damnation in hell. Those who **believe** by God's grace, trusting in Jesus Christ as their Savior, can be sure, after they die, that they will live forever with God in heaven. Pastor Brechbuhl

Winston Churchill reportedly said that "we make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give." According to Churchill, our lives are defined not by what we have gotten, but by what we give away. Our Lord's life is defined in this way. He gave completely of Himself for us. He became man for us. He taught the truth of God's Word. He healed those with many and various diseases. He died the death that we deserved for our sins. He gave of Himself in order to save us from sin, death and hell. And so it is that by giving completely of Himself. He got for Himself us, making us cit-izens of His eternal kingdom by grace. As it was for Jesus, so it also is for us. We get more from giving than we do from simply getting. For giving softens our hearts and frees us from the grip which the worries of this world and mak-ing a living has on us. For when we are singularly focused on making a living, we are singularly focused on what we get. That mindset begins to bleed into all areas of our lives — our relation-ships with and family, with neighbors and friends coworkers, and with the Lord. It shifts our fo-cus from asking the question, "How can I be a friend,

family member, neighbor and servant to others," to asking the question, "What have they done for me lately?" We become more selfish instead of selfless. But when we give, we do not have less, we do not become less; rather, we have more and be-come more. When we give, we join in the bond of friendship and family, the bond of service to those around us out of love for them. And love is the fulfillment of the Law. It is the nature of God Himself, for God is Love. Thus, we are participating in the divine nature.
